

Regulations of the Federal Foreign Office

Entry requirements

Commercial passenger air traffic has resumed. **However, there may be short-term reductions or suspensions of air traffic.**

Persons who have been in southern Africa in the last 14 days, which has been associated with the Omikron virus variant, will be denied entry.

Entry forms: Yes

In addition to the negative PCR test, all unvaccinated travelers (possibly already at the start of the trip) must prove the booking at one of the certified '[COVID-19 Safe Resorts](#)', present a flight ticket and provide proof of a valid foreign health insurance.

In addition, both a [health declaration](#) and a [passenger locator form](#) must be printed out and presented to the border guards.

Unvaccinated travelers, as well as travelers who have organized their own accommodation, must additionally complete a Health [Laboratory Form](#).

All documents can be submitted in a collective [form](#).

There is currently no reliable information available.

Transit

Information on quarantine regulations, testing regulations and possible exemptions for already vaccinated transit travellers can be found (if available) in the respective categories.

Covid-19 test required for entry: Yes

To be presented on entry: PCR test. Implementation of PCR/LAMP/TMA tests before entry: 72 hours. Mandatory on entry: PCR-Test. There is no information about a possible exemption of children and adolescents from the test obligation.

The proof of testing (if offered by the test station/pharmacy/etc.) should also include the passport/identity card number of the traveller(s), as this is required by some airlines for

carriage. We would like to point out that some countries generally only accept an "RT-PCR test" processed and evaluated in the laboratory for entry. Other PCR tests such as .B Express PCR Test, PoC PCR Test or PCR Rapid Test can sometimes result in entry being denied.

Since 01.10., both vaccinated and unvaccinated travelers must present a 72h old PCR test upon entry. Vaccinated people undergo an antigen test upon arrival at the hotel as well as on the 5th day of their stay. If vaccinated travellers have organised their own accommodation, a free PCR test will be carried out on arrival at the airport and a self-performed antigen test will be required after 5 days.

Unvaccinated travelers undergo a paid PCR test upon arrival at the airport, as well as on days 7 and 14 at their booked quarantine hotel.

Quarantine on entry: Yes

Quarantine duration: 14 days.

Unvaccinated travelers must book a 14-day quarantine stay at a [quarantine hotel](#) prior to **departure. They are retested on the day of entry, on the 7th and 14th days of quarantine and are not allowed to leave their rooms during quarantine (meals are eaten in the rooms).** A fee may be payable when reserving the hotel. After quarantine, travelers are allowed to move freely around the country.

Since 01.10., hotel quarantine has been cancelled for fully vaccinated travellers and they are allowed to move around the island after the result of their antigen test/PCR test has been announced.

Full vaccination required for entry: No

There are no known restrictions.

Entry facilitation for fully vaccinated persons: Yes

There is no quarantine for fully vaccinated people upon entry. The vaccination must have been completed 14 days before entry.

Mauritius recognizes (contrary to information) the vaccines of AstraZeneca (Covishield and Vaxzevria), Covaxin, Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, Pfizer/BioNTech, Sinopharm, Sputnik and Sinovac - CoronaVac.

Since 01.10. fully vaccinated travelers are allowed to enter quarantine-free. The obligation to present a negative PCR test (not older than 72h) upon entry remains in place. Children up to 18 years of age do not need vaccination.

Acceptance of cross-vaccinations: Yes

There are no known restrictions.

Entry facilitation for partially vaccinated: No

For partially vaccinated there are no entry facilitations.

Entry facilitation for convalescents: Yes

There is no quarantine for convalescents upon entry.

Attention: Convalescents need official proof that they also received a vaccination after their recovery, which was not less than 14 days before departure. Then they are considered fully vaccinated.

On site

Relief for convalescents, vaccinated, tested

On site, there are reliefs only for vaccinated people.

Vaccinated travelers are free to choose their hotel again and move individually around the island without major restrictions. Excursions and the rental of a rental vehicle are possible again.

Restaurant and fast-food visits are only possible with proof of vaccination. Also, the use of sports facilities is only possible for vaccinated people.

7-day incidence below 50: Yes

Current value: 30. Previous week: 17

Data source: Our World in Data / European Center for Disease Control. The data are only available at country level and are updated daily.

Restrictions on freedom of movement

Unvaccinated travelers are only allowed to leave the hotel and associated beach facilities after a negative PCR test on the 14th day to travel the country.

Lockdown

Lockdown provisions have largely been lifted. Regionally, there may be deviations.

Hygiene/spacing rules

Masks are **mandatory** in public; a minimum distance of 1 meter to other people must be observed. Temperature measurements must also be expected. Private and public meetings (e.g. Weddings and funerals) are **limited to 50 people**.

Shops

Shops and markets are open.

Gastronomy

Restaurants are open. Bars remain closed.

Most restaurants are only accessible to fully vaccinated people.

Hotel industry

Stays for the unvaccinated are only possible in certified hotels that are also used as quarantine facilities.

Fully vaccinated people are allowed to use gyms, spa areas (except saunas and hammams) and hotel leisure activities upon receipt of their antigen test.

Events

Cultural events can take place with up to 50 people.

Only 10 people are allowed to enter places of worship.

Sports & Leisure

Outdoor sports are allowed again. Beaches and national parks are open. Bars and discotheques have been closed again since 12.11., concerts and sports competitions as well as cultural events are prohibited.

Transport

Public transport is back in operation. Masks are mandatory.

Air traffic

The international flight operations and also the connections to La Réunion were resumed on 15.07.

Other

For COVID-19 symptoms, a call to the government hotline (8924) is recommended. There are at least 25 quarantine centres on the island, including some holiday hotels.

Covid-19 Testing Centre:

COVID-19 testing can be done at Wellkin Hospital's C Lab on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. The results will be available within 48 hours, please make an appointment at 605-1000. The cost is about \$60.

If travelers test positive, they quarantine themselves for 10 days in a self-chosen accommodation. This may be left with a negative COVID test.

Departure

Covid-19 PCR test required for departure: No

PCR tests can be done before departure if travelers need it for their destination country. The cost is Rs 2500 – 3500 (50-70 €).

There are no exit regulations for Mauritius.

Entry/return journey to Germany

Entry modalities Germany

Travellers who enter Germany by land, air or sea and have stayed within the previous 10 days in a **region designated by the Robert Koch Institute (RKI) as a high-risk [or virus variant area](#)** at the time of entry must **register** digitally before entering the country. The confirmation (PDF) must be presented to the carrier. The information is automatically forwarded to the competent health authorities at the destination. For travellers entering from a **risk-free area**, **there is no obligation to register** when returning to Germany. The exact regulations as well as exceptions (e.B. for transit travelers) can be found in the [leaflet](#) of the Ministry of Health.

Place of departure Risk area according to RKI: No

Overall classification as a risk-free area according to the Robert Koch Institute.

Mauritius is no longer considered a high-risk area since 01.01.

Test obligation before returning to Germany: Yes

For entries into Germany, there is a test obligation by air, land and sea. The test must have been carried out 48 hours before entry.

Since 1 August, all persons entering the Federal Republic of Germany, regardless of means of transport, must provide proof of complete vaccination, recovery or a negative test. This applies regardless of whether the previous stay was in a risk-free or risk-free area. The proof can be required by the Federal Police or the competent authority when checking cross-border traffic to Germany and must be presented to airlines before carriage.

The test (PCR, LAMP, TMA or antigen test) must have been carried out since 22.12. no more than **48 hours** before arrival. **Antibody tests are not allowed.**

In the case of air travel, the proof of testing should in any case include the passport/identity card number of the traveller(s), as this is required by some airlines for carriage.

There may be exceptions for delivery traffic, commuters and other groups of people. Children under the age of 6 are also exempt from testing requirements.

Different regulation for virus variant areas: Only a PCR test is valid here; **Antigen tests are no longer permitted.**

Test required after entry into Germany: No

There is no obligation to test after entering Germany.

Quarantine on entry/return: No

According to the Robert Koch Institute, it is a **risk-free area**, so there is no quarantine obligation after returning or entering Germany.

Entry facilitation for fully vaccinated persons: Yes

There is no testing or quarantine requirement for fully vaccinated people upon entry/return journey. Full vaccination must be provided 14 days prior to entry.

Vaccinated people are exempt from quarantine and testing obligations nationwide. However, this does not apply when entering from virus variant areas. Vaccinated persons must provide proof of complete vaccination protection. At least 14 days must have passed since the last required vaccination. (Attention: In Germany, only four vaccines – BioNTech/Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Johnson & Johnson – have been approved so far. Only people who have been given one of the approved vaccines are considered fully vaccinated.) Vaccinated people must not have symptoms of possible Covid-19 infection. Further information is provided by the [Federal Government](#).

Entry facilitation for partially vaccinated persons: Yes

There is no quarantine for partially vaccinated people upon entry/return.

According to the Robert Koch Institute, it is a **risk-free area**, so there is no quarantine obligation after returning or entering Germany.

Entry facilitation for convalescents: Yes

There is no obligation to test or quarantine convalescents upon entry/return journey.

Convalescents are exempt from quarantine and testing obligations nationwide, unless they have entered Germany from a virus variant area. Convalescents need proof of a positive PCR test (or other nucleic acid detection) that dates back at least 28 days and a maximum of six months. Convalescents must not have symptoms of possible Covid-19 infection. Further information is provided by the [Federal Government](#).

Note: The entry and quarantine regulations and the situation on site may change at any time at short notice or individual exceptional cases may occur.
